Dayton, OH – The Birthplace of Aviation

The DESRON 30 reunion was held at the Crowne Plaza in Dayton, OH, on September 23-27. It is a beautiful hotel; our hospitality room was on the roof (the Orville Room) with a view of the city. What better place to meet new friends and get re-acquainted with old shipmates?

There was a complimentary reception on Sunday in our hospitality room. This reception included an assorted cheese and fresh fruit display, vegetables with dip, coffee and punch. Special guests at the reception included Essie Bowman and her two daughters. (Essie's daughter's brought her to the reception as they couldn't stay for the reunion; her husband served on the USS Cotten.)



Monday was a great day for a tour – bright and sunny – and 44 people went on this tour. Our first stop was the Wright-Dunbar Interpretive Center and Aviation Trail Visitor Center. The first thing we saw was a brief movie on the Wright Brothers, which set the stage for the remainder of the visit. The second floor of the museum houses the Aviation Trail Parachute Museum, which covered things such as parachute research and development, modern uses, and the free fall parachute. Next door to the museum is The Wright Cycle Company, and the building is one of only two original buildings still standing at its original location where the Wright Brothers manufactured bicycles on the first floor and operated a printing business on the second floor.



The tour then went to the Carillon Historical Park. This is a 65-acre outdoor museum containing 30 exhibit buildings. One of the exhibits at this museum was the original 1905 Wright Flyer III, the world's first practical airplane, which was invented and flown in Dayton by the Wright Brothers. There is also an exhibit of NCR cash registers that is quite extensive. Other things to see at this museum included a full scale, Ohio-made carousel, a B&O locomotive and caboose, a Conestoga wagon, a covered bridge, and a 1924 Sun Oil gas station. Lunch was on your own at Culp's Cafeteria, which was reminiscent of a 1950's diner.



Tuesday proved to be a little rainy, but that didn't stop 58 people from going on another tour. This tour went to the National Museum of the United States Air Force at Wright Patterson Air Force Base, and included a stop at the Presidential hangar as well as the Research and Development Gallery. This is the world's oldest and largest military aviation museum, housing more than 400 aerospace vehicles and thousands of personal artifacts. Various exhibits in the museum included WWI, WWII, "thanks for the memories" Bob Hope, the Cold War, and even a space display. The National Aviation Hall of Fame, where you could meet the heroes and heroines of aviation and space travel, is also located at the museum, as well as an IMAX movie theater. In the Presidential hanger there are nine Presidential aircraft on display, and you could actually walk through four of

them. While it was a long day and involved a lot of walking, there was so much history at your fingertips and so much to see.

The joint business meeting for all ships was held on Wednesday in Salon B. (See Business Meeting minutes on page 5.) During (and after) the business meeting the Crowne Plaza provided complimentary transportation to and from "The Greene," which is a shopping mall. Dinner that evening was held in Salon B/C, and included a memorial service for our departed shipmates. Josie Aliferakis rang the bell for the departed shipmates. Following the memorial service, Bill Lewis offered a prayer, and Stefan Kelly read a poem entitled, "When God Created the Military Wife," while substituting "Navy" for "Military" (see page 4). This poem was dedicated to Ed Thornton, who lost his wife earlier this year, as well as all other Navy spouses.

For dinner we had a garden salad, choice of an entrée (rosemary ½ chicken, pan seared tilapia, or twin filet of beef), mashed red potatoes, broccoli, rolls with butter, and for dessert either chocolate cake or carrot cake.



Our evening's entertainment was provided by First Class Drama and the Gem City Band. "Grand Ole Flag" was introduced by "Jerry Lewis" and "Dean Martin." Other songs performed included, "Chattanooga Choo Choo," "A, I'm Adorable," "Somewhere Over the Rainbow," and "God Bless the USA." "Jerry" and "Dean" ended the show by singing "Side by Side."

Following dinner door prizes were raffled off. These prizes included a Naval magazine, \$5 gift certificates to the Tin Can Sailor store, a coupon for a Naval Ships' Guide, a couple of Navy books, and, of course the 50-50 raffle. We actually had two winners for that raffle: Ed Thornton and Emilie Millar.

Dennis Holt ended the evening by thanking Dick Myers for hosting this year's reunion, and Dick also thanked everyone who helped with this year's reunion.

The reunion ended on Thursday, with all saying a fond farewell and lots of memories of another fantastic reunion. Special thanks to Dick

Myers for putting together this reunion, but even more thanks goes to all who attended... it wouldn't be special if you weren't there. Hope to see you in 2013 in Branson, Missouri!

DESRON 30 Annual Business Meeting – September 23, 2012

The meeting was called to order by President Richard Myers.

All present stood and said the Pledge of Allegiance.

President Myers asked the members who were veterans of WWII to rise. There were three present:

President Myers indicated that the meeting minutes for last year's Annual Meeting were published in the Winter 2011 newsletter and asked if there were any comments, objections or changes; there were none.

Treasurer's Report – President Myers indicated that the checking account currently held approximately \$8,400 prior to the expenses for the

reunion being paid. He estimated that after expenses, it will have approximately \$2,500 remaining. He then opened up for discussion the amount of dues that are charged, with his opinion that they could be maintained at \$10 for next year as some members do donate amounts larger than that.

President Myers then asked the group to recognize John and Nancy Bielot for putting the newsletter together; there was a round of applause.
Old Business

Last year at Tucson a destination for the 2013 reunion was not settled upon. Choices for the location being considered included:

After last year's reunion, members were asked to notify President Myers of their preference. He only received a very small number of votes (totals shown above). Discussion then occurred. There is information available in the Hospitality Room on the various locations. Bob Smithson indicated that he had recently attended a reunion event in Eugene, OR, for the U.S.S. Caperton and only two members of that organization from the west coast attended. A total of only 16 Caperton shipmates attended.

Bill Lewis indicated that he'd prefer to not repeat a location that the group had previously visited as he is 84 years old and not sure how much longer he'd be able to travel for one reason or another. We had a great time at all of the places that we've been, but there are other places to go.

A question was raised as to whether locations near national parks were considered. Generally what is available in the entire area is what is looked at when considering locations.

John Urato indicated that from what he remembers, for reunions west of the Mississippi less people attend than when the location is east of the Mississippi.

Dennis Holt offered to host another reunion in the Tucson, AZ area. It's easy to pick a location, but we have to keep in mind that someone needs to act as a host. Dennis and Richard attend Confabs to look at locations where to attend.

Phil Toconita indicated the Minneapolis/ St. Paul, MN area is undergoing a lot of construction, so it makes movement difficult at this time.

John Urato indicated that he'd like to go to Savanna, GA. He was there a couple of years ago and didn't have sufficient time to see everything

that was there. Richard Myers attended a Confab there recently and indicated that they have a nice museum.

The 4 locations being considered are:

- Branson, MO
- Washington, D.C., area
- Baton Rouge, LA
- Coastal area of OR

Weldon Hunt mentioned that where ever the group decides to go, we need to make sure that there is something of interest to the spouses to see and do. Richard Myers indicated that we still do that and that today the hotel will shuttle anyone that wishes to go to the Green Shopping Center.

President Myers reminded the members present that, according to our by-laws, only members in good standing (dues are paid up) are eligible to vote.

A question was raised regarding the cost of the hotel in the Washington, D.C., area as it is normally expensive. President Myers indicated that the hotel was offering the group an \$89/night rate near the airport (Dulles). However, there is currently construction taking place to extend the metro to the airport, and at this time it is unlikely that it will be completed in time for next year's reunion. It would be in place for 2014, and the hotel will offer the group the same rate.

He would vote for someplace else for 2013 and go to Washington in 2014. The hotel is a Crowne Plaza, near the airport. They think the metro station will be complete in about a year. Tours would be via bus, but the metro would allow access to the city without having to try to drive. A motion was made to vote on the four locations. Multiple votes will be taken eliminating one location each time. The motion was seconded.

Baton Rouge: \$89/night. USS Kidd, National WWII museum, LA historical Museum.

Branson: \$89/night. \$199 for show package. Hotel – Airport shuttle is ~\$12.

Washington: \$89/night. \$109/night inc breakfast for 2. Crowne Plaza (Dulles). Banquet meals are a little more expensive (\$38). Visited Gettysburg. About one hour away.

Additional discussion occurred regarding Branson and Washington. Based on the extensive discussion, the decision was made to propose going to Branson in 2013 and Washington in 2014.

The proposed date for Branson is 9/5-9/9. (*Editor's note: dates are confirmed and are now 9/18-9/22.*)

The hotel in Branson is the same hotel (Grand Plaza) that the U.S.S. Cotten had used. It was recently remodeled.

A motion was made to go to Branson in 2013 and Washington in 2014. The motion was seconded and passed. Next year we will vote on 2015.

Nominations of directors. A motion was made to keep the same slate of directors. The motion was seconded. Reminder - only active members can vote. The vote passed unanimously.

The organization's web site is www.desron30.org. The current password is 8tincans, which will allow you to access protected information on the web site such as shipmates' addresses and phone number. That information is not available to the general public.

President Myers mentioned that John Bielot had forwarded contact information for the Hartford (CT) Courant, where they will publish military reunions for no cost. He received a call from someone who was unaware of the organization.

A motion was made to end the meeting. The motion was seconded and passed.
